A sharing library and bench has been constructed.

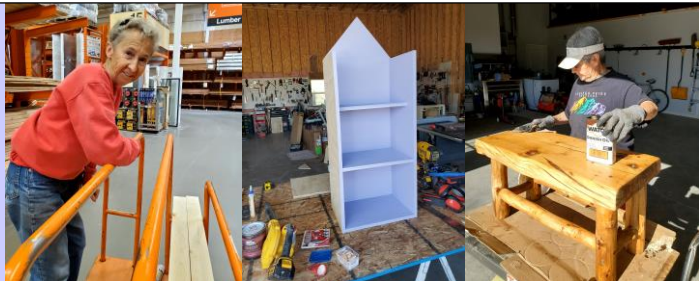


This project is nearly complete. Final tasks include the roof, paint, plaque, and confirming a location.

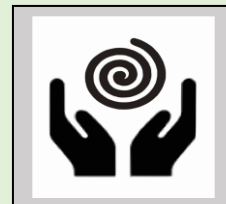
